## **Science Corner - Paul Cannon**

New technologies are changing our society in ways we can only imagine. We must prepare our students by helping them develop their ability to analyze and solve problems. We also need to create real world experiences which enable children to construct their own knowledge and combine this knowledge with what they already know. Therefore, this month I want to share with you two excellent in-service opportunities that have come to my attention which may be of interest to you.

The fourth annual **CONNECT** conference, ***Building a Web for Success*** is focused on how the integration of mathematics, science, and technology can **increase student learning** in K-12 schools, two-year colleges, and four-year institutions. The fourfold theme for this year includes: Curricular Integration, Individual Student Needs, Teacher Collaboration, and Standards. The conference will be held on Friday, May 1, from 9:00 a.m. to 2:50 p.m. at the Bone Student Center on the Illinois State University Campus. Sample presentations are:

- "Project Stormfront," a national project of infusing telecommunications in an elementary classroom to promote science learning in the K-5 classroom;
- "Crash Testing and Other Neat Mathematics," a series of hands-on activities that promote application of math formulas in high school;
- "Integrated Math, Science, and Technology: Active Learning at its Best," a middle school class that uses hands-on projects to integrate mathematics, science and technology with real-life issues.

Along with numerous handouts on integrating math, science, and technology, participants will be given a booklet on programs that integrate these three areas throughout Illinois. These handouts will provide useful ideas with contact names for more information from schools throughout Illinois.

The Midwest Consortium for Mathematics and Science Education/North Central Regional Education Laboratory's traveling resource exhibit of curriculum, funded by the National Science Foundation, is coming to this conference.

The full day of information, all take-homes, snacks, and lunch will cost \$45. **Gearing Up For Learning** is a Summer Workshop to be held on July 28, from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. in the Conferencing Unit, Illinois State University, Normal, Illinois. This workshop provides activities which integrate science, mathematics, and technology into real life applications. Participants will explore two areas of mechanical and structural engineering: energy and construction. All activities integrate the LEGO Dacta Technic 1 Simple Machines and the AIMS Brick Layers guide. Topics will include work, friction, inclined planes, levers, gears, and wheels and axles.

The cost is \$95, which includes a parking pass, a Technic 1 Kit, an AIMS Brick Layers book, and lunch. All materials and activities are correlated with the National Science Education Standards, Project 2061 Benchmarks for Science Literacy, and the National Council of Teachers of Mathematics Standards.

## Scientific Literacy Grant Showcase

A number of schools in Whiteside County are presently working on projects to integrate science, math, and technology into the curriculum. These projects are being funded through Science Literacy Grants from the Regional Office which were granted on a competitive basis. These projects will be "Showcased" and be available to all teachers in the county on May 13 from 1-5 p.m. at the Regional Office in Sterling. The teachers involved in these projects will be present and available to answer questions during this time. All teachers and administrators are invited to stop by the Regional Office to see what these teachers have done and to pick up some ideas for integration of science and math into the curriculum. More details on this afternoon of sharing will be coming to your building during the early part of April and will be in the next newsletter as well.

## StarNet

StarNet is offering a five-part series entitled *Assistive Technology in the Inclusive Classroom* during the spring months. The Regional Office will be taping these ten (10) hours of programming. The focus will be on students with hearing, vision, and orthopedic impairments. Topics will include, but are not limited to, IDEA, policy, IEP forms, terms, preparation of facilities and environment, planning instruction, stockpiling resources, using media and technology, and teaching and learning, day by day. Each program will offer strategies, resources, videotaped case studies, guest discussions, and onsite activities. If you would like a copy of this series, please contact Betty Clementz at the ROE so duplicates of the tapes may be made.

NASA will be providing two 30-minute programs also telecast over StarNet on April 23 entitled "*Microgravity - Doing More in Less*". This program will be in two segments for grades K - 4 and for grades 5 - 8. The NASA researcher will demonstrate to teachers and students the principle of microgravity and will participate in classroom activities designed to demonstrate the effects of microgravity in space. A classroom experiment from "Fizzy - Tablet Rockets" will also provide students with the process of scientific collection and analyzation of data. ## Internal Review Workshop

Eight districts in Whiteside County participated in a workshop on March 31 to assist the Internal Review Process which is to be implemented in the 1998-99 school year in all schools in Illinois. Carol Beal from the State Board of Education presented the hands-on workshop to teams represented by teachers, administrators, and community/board members. The workshop focused on the local districts using many of the items already available to them, e.g. school improvement plan, mission and goals, demographics of the district, data from assessments already on file, and goals for the district in a short term and long term plan. Districts that participated are being asked to submit a summary of their internal review process in mid-June. All team members will be invited to hear the reports. Monies obtained by the ROE through a grant are providing assistance to offset the expenses of substitutes or as stipends. School improvement is an on-going journey: the internal review provides the map of knowing where the school has been, where it is heading, and how it is going to arrive at that destination.

Foreign language teachers met to plan activities for a week dedicated to building an awareness in the schools and communities of Whiteside County of the need and results of second language acquisition. ## Prairie Preservation Society

The Executive Board of the Prairie Preservation Society of Ogle County has established a scholarship program for students carrying out field-oriented studies involving our native plants, animals, their habitats, soils, and geology.

The awards are for an amount of \$300 per project and will be judged according to specific criteria. The project site should be located within the Rock River Natural Heritage Corridor. The recipient, working under the guidance of a faculty member or project coordinator at a high school, college, or graduate school, will be performing some sort of experiment or observation primarily in a field setting.

Scholarship funds may be used in any way that facilitates the timely completion of the project, including such budget items as travel expenses, books, supplies, and tuition. A written report of the field research will be submitted to the Society.
